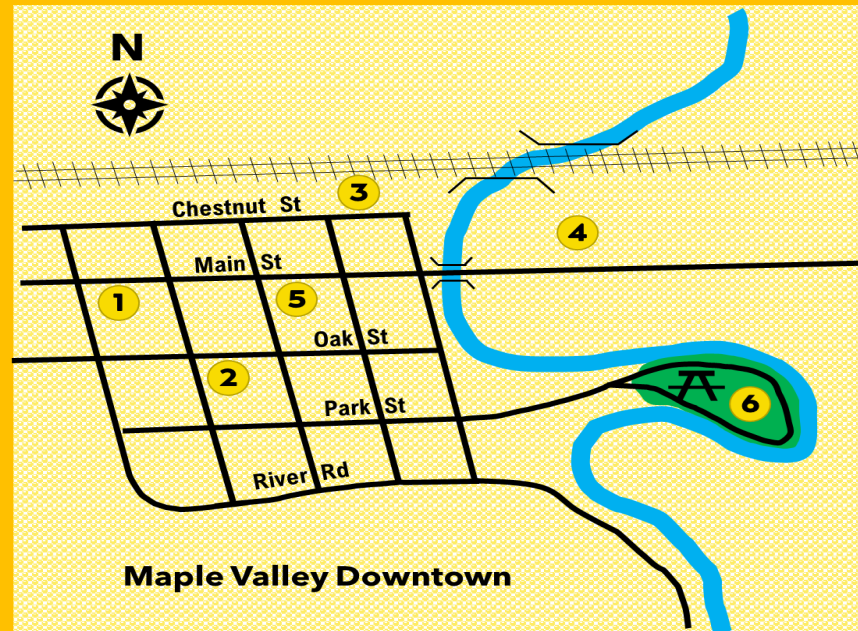
# Maple Valley Attractions and Character Synopsis
